## **Preface**

The Statistical Yearbook of Iran contains the latest statistical information available on the country's economic, social, cultural, and political areas to meet the statistical data needs of decision-makers, planners, and researchers, as well as all other interested users. The Yearbook has been released regularly since the year 1345.

The major sources of the Yearbook include: (a) the results of censuses and sample surveys conducted by the Statistical Centre of Iran (SCI), (b) administrative registers, and (c) the results of surveys conducted by other government organizations. Since the Population and Housing Census and also some other censuses and surveys conducted by the SCI or other organizations are not taken at regular intervals, some of the Yearbook's statistical items are not available annually and continuously.

The publications' information database of the Statistical Centre of Iran, as one of the components of the National Statistical Information Database, has been accessed on the web since the year 1381 through the National Statistical Portal at [www.amar.org.ir](http://www.amar.org.ir). In this database, which is continuously provided with statistical information, quick and easy access is provided to the information of the publications' tables of the SCI by using extensive search facilities, and currently, the information related to the National Statistical Yearbook 1399, is available to users in the section of statistical yearbook system of the National Portal of Statistics.

In addition to the mentioned database, the information of the National Statistical Yearbook for the years 1387 to 1395 is accessible through the electronic system of this publication with various capabilities at <http://salnameh.sci.org.ir>.

The 1399 Statistical Yearbook of Iran is released both in Persian and English. The Persian version is published in both hard and soft copies. However, the English version is released just in soft copy, moreover, both Persian and English e-copies are also available to the users on [www.amar.org.ir](http://www.amar.org.ir) (the English version of the Website).

In addition, at the same time as the release of the statistical yearbook of the country, the statistical yearbooks of 31 Ostans (provinces) are prepared and published by the Management and Planning Organization of the Ostans with a similar format under the supervision of the Statistical Center of Iran.

Before going through the chapters, users are recommended to study the introductions which take in the definitions and concepts concerned and the subject-matter coverage of the statistical items, as important points needed for the statistics of each Chapter, carefully. Furthermore, they provide readers with justifications for the unavailability of some timely data or the exclusion of some statistical items.

It is noteworthy that the yearbook starts with selected information from all chapters and the beginning of every chapter includes selected information from that chapter. In order to have a general view of all information presented in the Yearbook, reading of these parts is recommended.

Particular thanks and appreciation are extended to all the Director-Generals of Statistics and Information Offices of the ministries, organizations, and the Islamic Revolution Institutions as well as all their colleagues who helped us in this great job. Their generous and valuable assistance contributed a lot to the preparation of the Yearbook. We hope to enjoy their cooperation and contribution continuously to enhancing the yearbook quantitatively and qualitatively. Special thanks should go to my colleagues in the Statistical Centre of Iran who contributed to the preparation and production of this publication.

## Selected information

Iran comprises a land area of over 1.6 million square kilometers. It lies in the southern half of the northern temperate zone, between latitudes 25° 4' and 39° 46' north, and longitudes 44° 2' and 63° 19' east. The land's average height is over 1200 meters. The lowest place, located in Chaleh-ye-Loot is only 56 meters high, while the highest point, the Damavand peak in the Alborz Mountains, rises as high as 5610 meters. The land height at the southern coastal strip of the Caspian Sea is 28 meters lower than the open seas.

Iran is bounded by Turkmenistan, Caspian Sea, Azerbaijan, and Armenia on the north, Afghanistan and Pakistan on the east, Oman Sea and the Persian Gulf on the south, and Iraq and Turkey on the west.

In the year 1399, Iran has 31 Ostans (provinces), 457 Shahrestans (sub-provinces), 1126 Bakhshes (counties), 1395 Shahrs (cities), and 2674 Dehestans (rural agglomerations).

In the year 1399, the area of zones protected by the Iran Department of Environment was about 18996161 hectares, of which the Ostans of Kerman with 2409268 hectares and Alborz with 8467 hectares had the highest and lowest areas respectively.

In that year, a number of 3683 conflagrations happened in the forests and ranges which shows a rise of 45 percent in comparison with the previous year.

In the year 1399, the average volume of collected wastewater was 5720555 cu m which shows a 0.7 percent rise compared to the year 1398. The Ostans of Tehran and Khuzestan with 21.2 percent and 9.2 percent had the most collected wastewater volume and the Ostans of Yazd and South Khorasan with 0.4 percent of the total nation's wastewater had the lowest volumes.

In the year 1398, among the pollutant and greenhouse gases resulting from the burning of fuels in the transportation sector, CO<sub>2</sub> with 156389355 tons had the greatest portion; namely 92.1% of the total pollutant and greenhouse gases emitted in this sector. It should be cited that the greatest portion of CO<sub>2</sub> production is related to the burning of gasoline and the lowest one goes to liquefied gas.

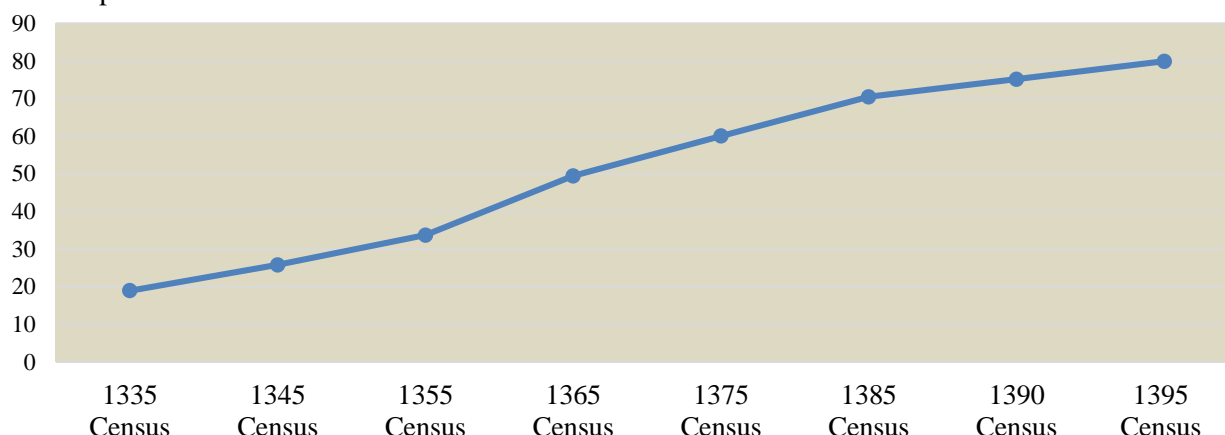
In the year 1399, 52 percent of the population of the country was under the coverage of the network for collection and transmission services of urban sewage, which shows a 1 percent rise compared to the previous year. The highest share of the population under the coverage of this network belongs to the Ostan of Kordestan with 95 percent and the lowest share of the population under the coverage of this network goes to the Ostan of Kerman with 13 percent.

According to the Population and Housing Census taken in the month of Aban, 1395, the total population of the country was 79926270 persons (comprising 50.7% male & 49.3% female); compared to the result of the Census in the year 1390, the average annual population growth was 1.2%. In the 1395 Census, there were 24.2 million households out of whom about 74.9% were settled in urban areas and the rest (25.1%) was settled in the rural areas. In the mentioned year, the mean age for men and women was 31.1.

In the year 1399, over 1.11 million births were registered, out of which 48.4 percent were female. Moreover, more than 556,000 marriages and more than 183 thousand divorces were recorded over the year 1399, showing an increase of about 4.4% and 3.6%, respectively in comparison with the preceding year.

Million persons

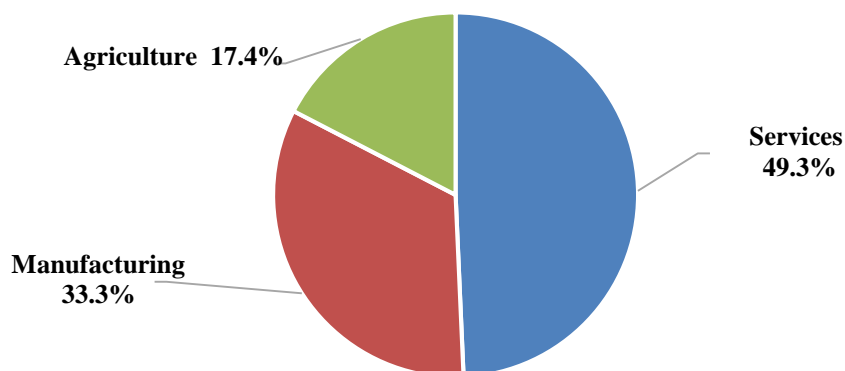


According to the results of the Labour Force Survey in the year 1399, 41.3% of the population aged 15 and over is considered economically active, whose unemployment rate was 9.6% out of whom 8.4% and 15.6% were men and women, respectively. Moreover, the unemployment rates in urban and rural areas were 10.4 and 7.2 percent, respectively.

Also, in the year 1399, the unemployment rates of economically active people aged 15-24 and 18-35 were 23.7 and 21.8 percent, respectively.

In the mentioned year, amongst Ostans of the country, Lorestan and Chaharmahal & Bakhtiari with 15.2 % as well as Kermanshah and Kordestan with 14.9 and 14 percent had the highest unemployment rate, respectively while South Khorasan and Khorasan-e-Razavi, with 6.2 percent and also Ilam and Tehran with 6.7 and 7.2 percent experienced the lowest unemployment rate of the country, respectively.

In the year 1399, the total volume of the aquatics caught from the northern and southern waters was about 715 thousand tons and the amount of produced aquatics was over 553 thousand tons.

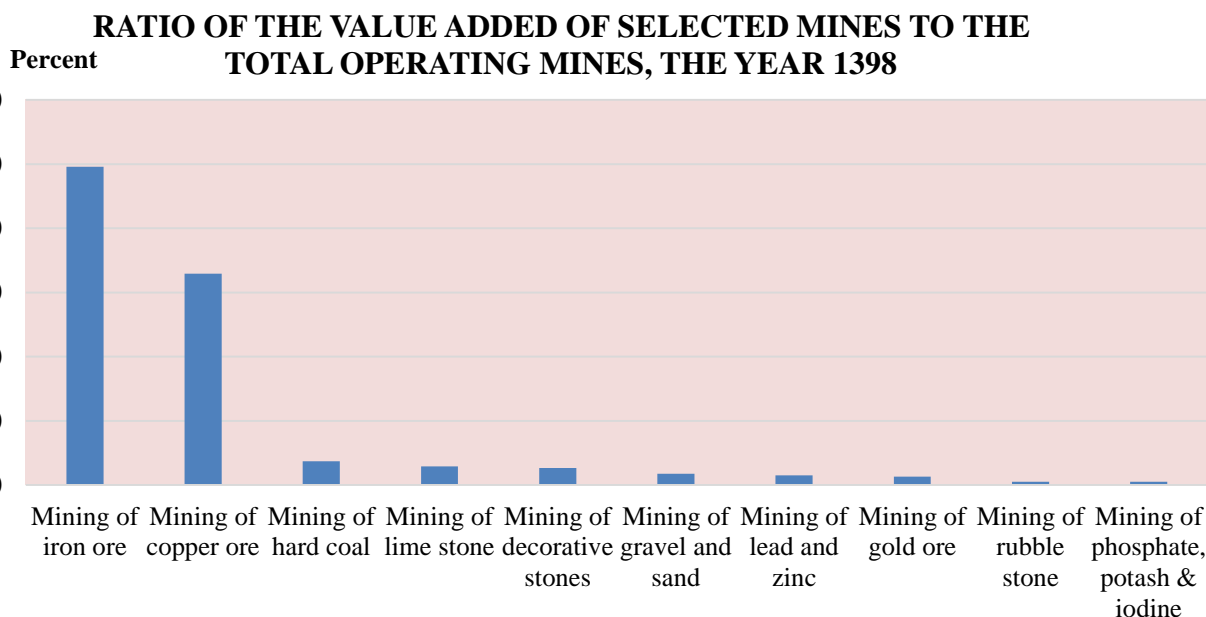
Out of the total number of caught aquatics, over 31 thousand tons were from the northern waters and over 684 thousand tons from the southern waters.

In the National Census of Agriculture conducted in the year 1393, a number of 4042811 holders were identified and listed nationwide and for 10344 holders no questionnaire was filled out due to various reasons.

In the year 1398, there were 4974 operating mines in the country. The results show that a total of 107074 persons were working in these mines and the number of workers increased by 7.4 percent in contrast to the year 1397.

In the year 1398, the value of mine products amounted to 650310315 million rials. Iron ore, copper ore, and coal with 358997338, 180582726, and 20678312 million rials accounted for the highest annual production value, respectively.

In the year 1398, the value added of the nation's operating mines activity amounted to 496500693 million rials. Iron ore, copper ore, and coal with 246080726, 163365359 and 18405924 million rials had the highest value-added, respectively. The total value added of these mines accounted for about 86.2% of the sector's total value added.



In the year 1399, a total of 793488 thousand barrels of crude oil were exported, which shows a 9% increase compared to the preceding year.

In the year 1399, a number of 1215 cities and 34149 villages were supplied with piped gas, and 28 cities and 2632 villages were supplied with piped gas. Also, 24360 thousand tons valued at 8824 million dollars were exported, the amount of which increased by 22 percent in amount and 9 percent decreased in value respectively.

In the year 1398, there were 29148 manufacturing establishments with 10 and more workers totaling 1803811 employed persons, which decreased by 0.1 percent and increased by 4 percent, respectively compared to the previous year. The ownership of 99.1 percent of the establishments was for the private sector and about 0.9 percent for the public sector.

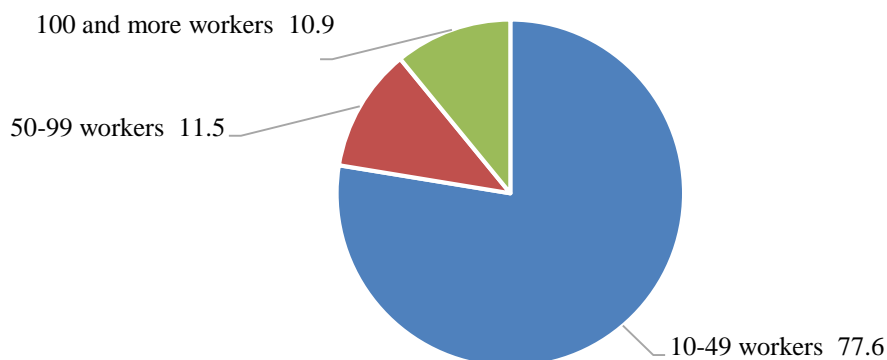
Besides, out of the number of employed, 25.7 percent were employed in establishments with 10-49 workers, 12.6 percent in establishments with 50-99 workers, and 61.7 percent were employees of establishments with 100 and more workers.

In the same year, the value-added of the industrial activity of manufacturing establishments with 10 and more workers was 4650900175 million rials which increased by 49.1 percent compared to the preceding year.

In the year 1398, Bushehr, Khuzestan, and Hormozgan Ostans with 2603072, 642861, and 544988 million rials had the highest manufacturing establishments productivity with 10 and more workers,

respectively, and also Bushehr, Khuzestan and Hormozgan Ostans with 19581.1, 5225.7 and 4700.7 million rials had the highest workers' productivity in manufacturing establishments with 10 and more workers, respectively.

In the aquatic year 1398-1399, the amount of annual discharge of the underground water resources was about 65115 million cu m, which had a 3.9 percent increase in comparison with the aquatic year 1397-1398.

In the year 1399, the inflow of the large reservoir dams amounted to 48366 million cu m which had a 39.7% decrease in comparison with the last year. In this year, 41254 million cu m of large reservoir dams has been consumed, 59.6 percent of which belong to agricultural consumptions.

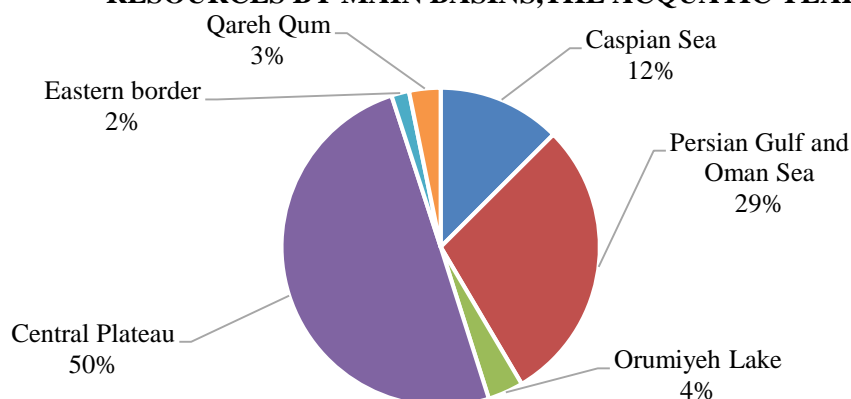
In the year 1399, there were over 23 million and 511 thousand urban and rural water extensions that had a 2.5 percent increase in comparison with the preceding year. Out of this number, over 17 million and 506 thousand extensions were in urban areas which had a 2.5% increase compared to the previous year.

In the year 1399, the gross electricity generation of institutions affiliated with the Ministry of Energy was 139068 million kilowatt-hours, of which about 43.1 percent has been produced in the steam power plants. Furthermore, the gross electricity generation amount had a 4.9 percent increase compared to the preceding year.

Among all electricity customers in the year 1399, the percentage of customers in the house, public, agricultural, and manufacturing sectors was 80.2, 4.8, 1.3, and 0.7 percent, respectively. Also in this year, the percentage of the sold electricity that was consumed in the house, manufacturing, agricultural, and public sectors and for streets lighting was 31.7, 37.2, 14.2, 8.5, and 1.7 percent respectively.

At the end of the year 1399, a number of 57755 villages (over 4.5 million rural households) were electrified which increased by 0.1% in comparison with the previous year.

In the year 1399, over 174000 construction permits with 93602 thousand sq. m floor areas were issued by municipalities, which increased by 15.7 percent and 26.8 percent, respectively in comparison with the preceding year. It is noteworthy that over 85.6 percent of the permits issued are related to housing units.

In the year 1399, the number of private sector investments made by the private sector in urban areas for buildings whose construction is newly started, semi-finished, and completed was about 3271496 billion rials, which increased by 104.2 percent in comparison with the previous year.

In the year 1399, the Shahr (cities) of Tehran, Esfahan, and Tabriz with 245539, 97367 and 83851 thousand rials had the maximum average price and Yasuj, Khorramabad, and Ilam with 13395, 25144 and 26387 thousand rials had the minimum average price per sq. m of the housing unit's floor area transacted in the real estates' agencies. Besides, in the same year, the Shahr (cities) of Tehran, Karaj, and Tabriz with 630969, 258180 and 189305 rials had the maximum average price, respectively and Ilam, Yasuj and Yazd with 60534, 61957 and 63980 rials had the minimum average price per sq m of the housing unit's floor area transacted in the real estate agencies between the landlord and leaseholder.

In the year 1399, the volume of the nation's foreign trades amounted to 9054 thousand billion rials, which increased by 96.1 percent in comparison with the preceding year. Out of the stated volume, 18 and 82 percent were related to imports and non-oil exports, respectively.

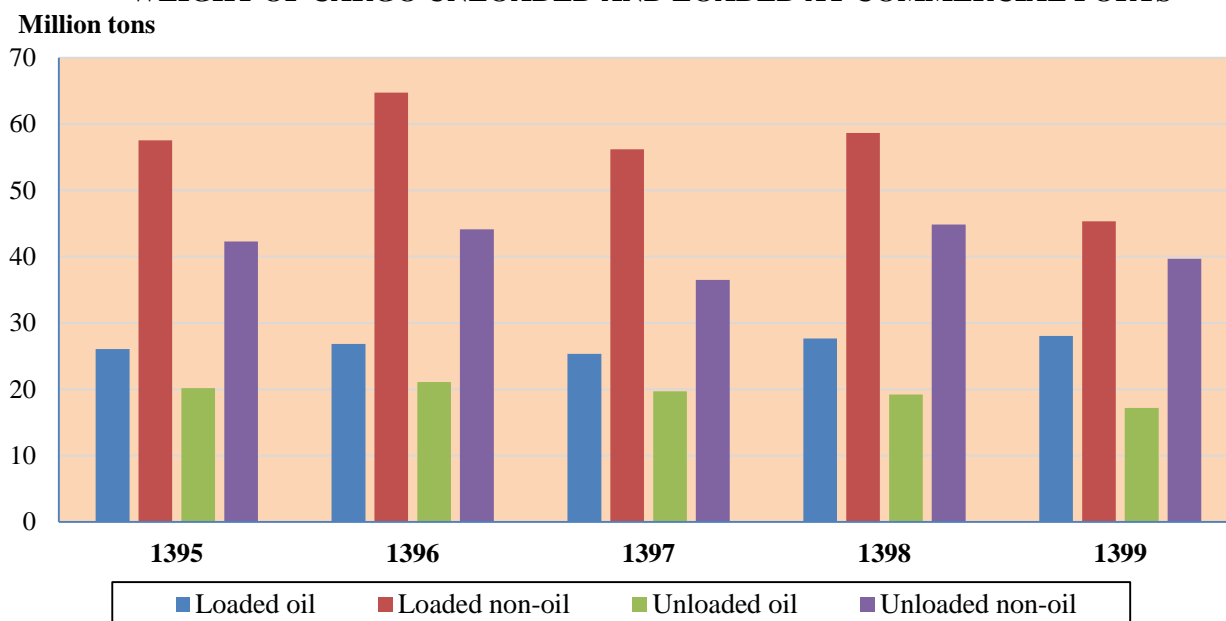
In the year 1399, about 33.7 million tons of different goods amounting to 1634 thousand billion rials were imported into the country via customs terminals whose value decreased by 11.7 percent in comparison with the year 1398. It should be noted that the maximum volume of imports by value at rials relates to the countries of China (25.3 percent out of total value), UAE (25.1 percent out of total value), and Turkey (11.3 percent of the total value).

Moreover, in that year, over 113.2 million tons of various kinds of non-oil goods at the value of 7420 thousand billion rials were exported abroad via customs terminals whose value increased by 62.6 percent in comparison with the preceding year. The highest volume of exports by value at rials relates to the countries of China, (25.9 percent out of total value), Iraq (21 percent out of total value), and UAE (13 percent out of total value).

In the year 1399, the length of railway lines (main lines, shunting tracks, and industrial-commercial lines) was 15040 kilometers, which increased by about 1.8 percent in comparison with the preceding year. In the year 1399, the number of passengers transported via railways was 11 million and 103 thousand persons. In the mentioned year, the length of intercity roads was 84,801 kilometers and the length of rural roads was 135,545 kilometers.

In the year 1399, the number of passengers transported via public road passenger vehicles (bus, minibus, and passenger vehicles) was over 92 million persons. In the year 1399, the volume of goods unloaded and loaded at the commercial ports of the country was about 57 and over 73 million tons, respectively.

In the year 1399, the total number of installed telephones was 38762440 out of which 29139278 telephones are in use. The number of installed telephones and telephones in use decreased by 0.6% and increased by 0.5%, respectively compared to the previous year. In the year 1399, the total number of ceded mobile phone lines including Hamrah Aval, Irancell, and Rightel operators was 201344209 out of which 26729195 and 174615014 were postpaid and prepaid lines, respectively. In the same year, the total number of mobile phones in use was 131054740 out of which 24033414 and 107021326 were postpaid and prepaid lines, respectively.

At the end of the year 1399, the total number of operating mobile phone subscribers was 131054740 lines which increased by 11% compared to the previous year. Out of this number, the Ostans of Tehran, Khorasan-e-Razavi, Esfahan, Fars, and Khuzestan with 23568680, 10651174, 8392811, 8021161 and 7900171 had the highest mobile phone subscribers compared to other Ostans, respectively.



In the year 1396, coverage of the population aged six and over with a mobile phone was 80.7%. In that year, the total number of nationwide high-speed Internet lines is 10600050, out of which 9377030 lines are for household and 1223020 lines are for commercial use.

In the year 1399, the capacity of inter-city optical fiber was 71188 kilometers while international Internet bandwidth was 5170 and domestic IP network capacity was 25073 gigabytes/second.

In the year 1399, the total amount of liquidity (money and quasi-money) was about 34761.7 thousand billion rials, which increased by 40.6 percent compared to the previous year.

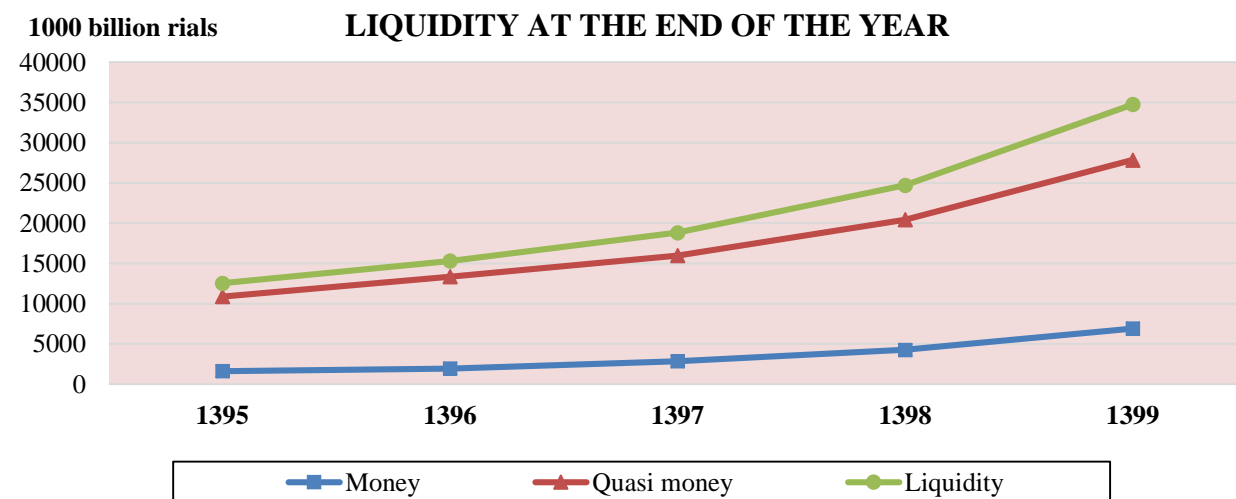
Over the same year, claims of the banking system in the public sector were about 5609.8 thousand billion rials, showing a rise of 34.7 percent compared with the year 1398.

In the year 1399, claims of banks and non-bank credit institutions on non-public sectors were about 24065.4 thousand billion rials which increased by 48.4 percent compared to the previous year.

The balance of non-government sector deposits with the banking system in the year 1399 was about 34026.7 thousand billion rials, which shows a growth of 41.1 percent compared to the previous year.

In the year 1399, the highest amounts of premiums received in the insurance market of the country for three fields were as follows: third party and surplus (197.8 thousand billion rials), health (154.7 thousand billion rials), and life car body insurance (58.4 thousand billion rials) showing 36.5, 18.9 and 52.7 percent increase, respectively compared to the previous year.

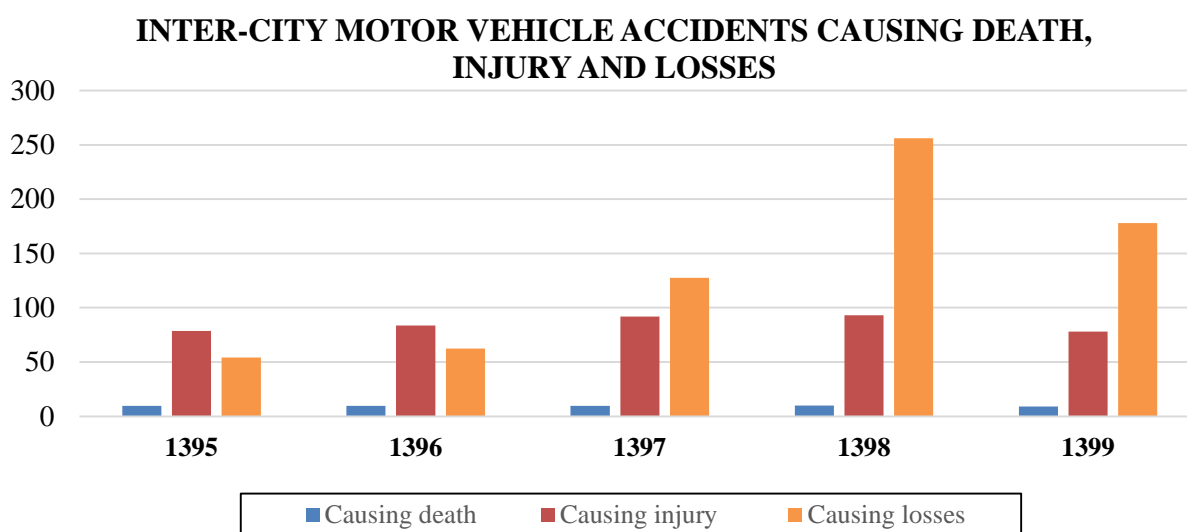
Over the same year, the value of the transacted shares of the eligible companies (on the Tehran Stock Exchange) was more than 26955.0 thousand billion rials which increased by 425.8 percent compared to the previous year.



In the year 1399, there were 3475, 605, and 253 branches in operation in general courts, courts of appeal, and revolutionary courts which increased by 5.5 percent, and decreased by 14.2 and 2.0 percent, respectively compared to the preceding year.

In the year 1399, there were 221476 and 16122 robberies from private and government buildings registered by the Police Department of the I.R of Iran, which increased by 32.0 and 33.6 percent, respectively, compared to the preceding year. Moreover, in the year 1399, robberies from houses with 123869 cases, shops with 30999 ones, car theft with 83624, and motorbike theft with 86026 cases were registered by the Police Department, which increased by 3.1%, 16.3%, 6.0% percent, and car theft decreased by 1.7%, respectively in comparison with the preceding year.

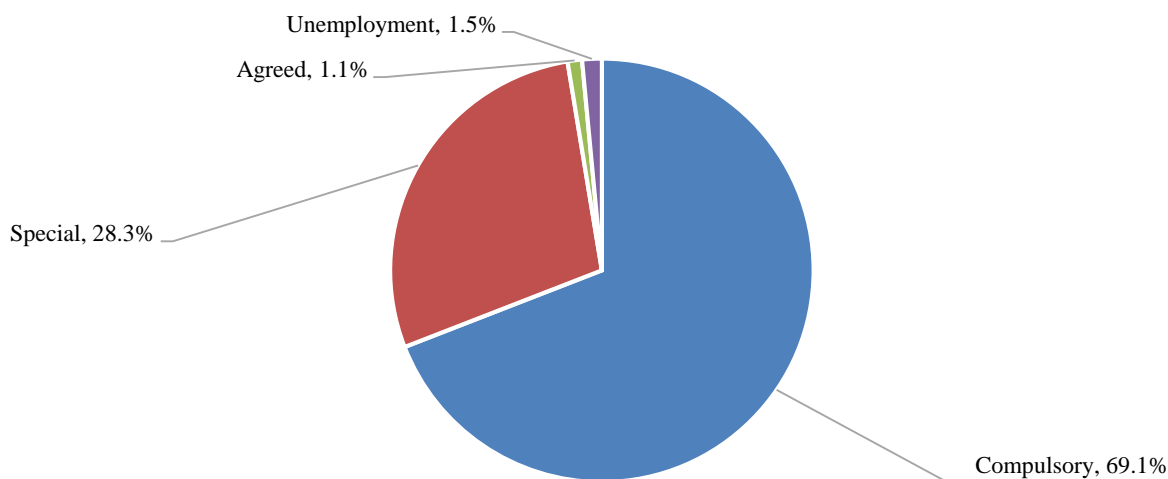
In the year 1399, the number of intra-city car accidents with a 32.7% decrease in comparison with the previous year stood at 1176150 cases, out of which 0.3% were for accidents causing death, 14.1% for casualty, and 85.6% for losses. Also, the percentage of inter-city accidents with a 26.1% decrease in comparison with the previous year stood at 266051 cases, out of which 3.4% of accidents resulted in death, 29.4% in casualty, and 67.3% in losses.



At the end of the year 1399, the number of establishments covered by the Social Security Organization was 1304933. During the same period, the principal insured persons covered by the mentioned organization increased to 14584801 persons, showing a rise of 1.5 percent compared to the previous year.

During the year 1399, a number of 42278338 insured people were covered by Iran Health Insurance Organization (principal and dependent) out of which 12.3% were government employees, 0.9% were under Iranians' insurance, 32.4% under the Public Health Insurance, 48% were villagers, and other walks of life accounted for 6.3%.

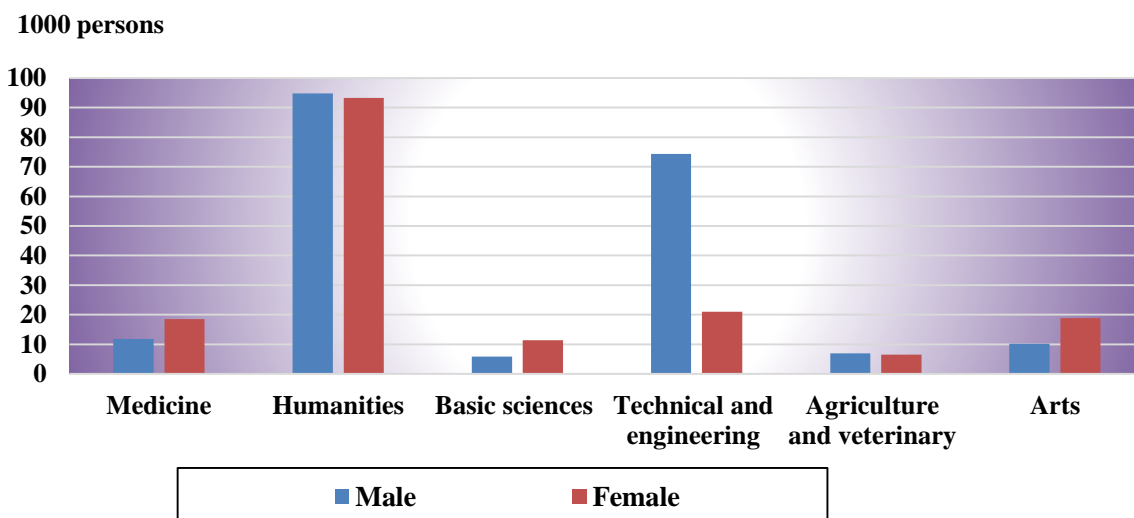
During the academic year 1399-1400, about 8 million 444 thousand persons were studying at primary schools, more than 3 million 540 thousand persons were at lower secondary schools, and more than 2 million 765 thousand persons were at upper secondary schools

The total number of university students (except for the students of Islamic Azad University) over the academic year 1399-1400 was more than 2 million and 104 thousand persons.

Out of the total students, about 12.7 percent of students were studying for an associate's, about 62.9 percent for a bachelor's, about 16.0 percent for a master's, 3.9 percent for a professional doctorate, and 4.4 percent for specialty doctorate levels.

Over the academic year 1398-99, out of 373,000 graduates from universities and higher education institutes (except for the students of Islamic Azad University), the graduates in technical and engineering courses, humanities, arts, agriculture and veterinary, medicine, and basic sciences accounted for 25.5, 50.4, 7.8, 3.6, 8.1 and 4.6, percent, respectively.

In the year 1399, the number of physicians and paramedics employed by the University of Medical Science was 52968 and 285834, respectively, out of whom 16839, 5215, 304, 2561, 18342, 2917, and 6790 were general practitioners, dentists, doctors of medical laboratory sciences, pharmacists, specialists, sub-specialists, and professional doctors, respectively.

In the year 1399, the number of hospitals was 1032, out of which 703 hospitals were state-run, and 329 hospitals were run by the private sector, respectively.

In the year 1399, the number of hospital beds in the country was 161377, out of which 142768 were available (active) beds.

In the year 1399, there were 5834, 5621, and 17499 operating health care, medical centres, health care stations, and health homes, respectively.

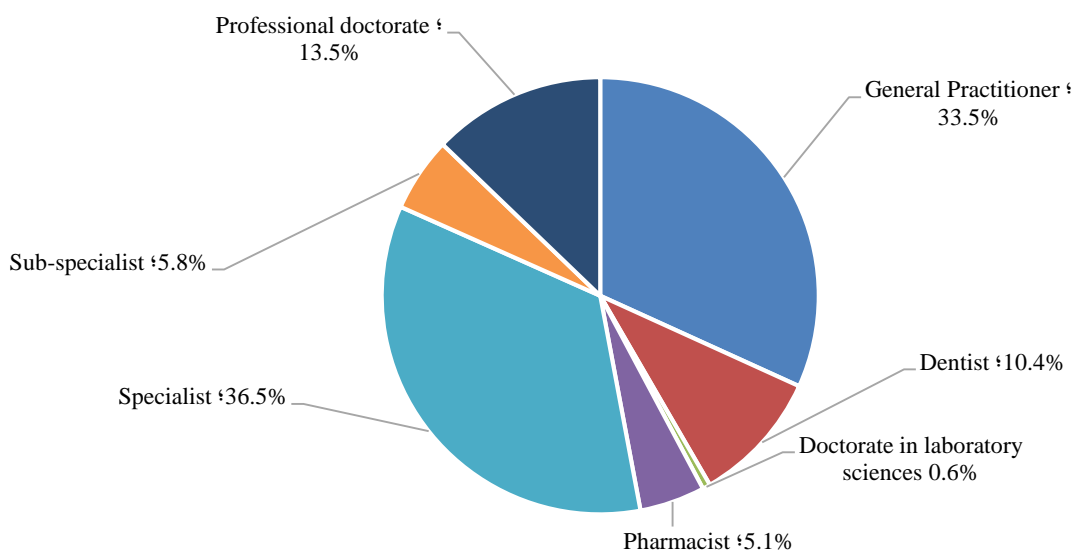
In the same year, there were 5142 medical and genetic diagnostic laboratories, out of which 5004 were medical diagnostic laboratories, and 138 were genetic diagnostic laboratories. In the year 1399, the total number of operating pharmacies was 12474.

In the same year 1399, there were 2688 pre-hospital emergency stations in the country, out of which 1061 and 1627 stations were urban (39.5%) and road (60.5%) stations, respectively.

In the same year, a number of 2399392 blood donors visited the blood centres, and 1905427 units of blood were donated, totally.

In the year 1399, there were 2195 veterinarian pharmacies, 1347 livestock vaccination centres, and 1786 private veterinarian clinics.

In the year 1399, the highest and lowest number of programmes produced by the national radio was about social issues with more than 72 thousand hours, and science and technology with more than 10 thousand hours, respectively. Moreover, in the same year, the highest and lowest number of programmes produced on national T.V was about social and science, and technology topics.

In the year 1399, the number of attendances in 636 active cinemas was 679,000 persons that decreased by 97 percent compared to the previous year, due to the outbreak of the Corona virus.

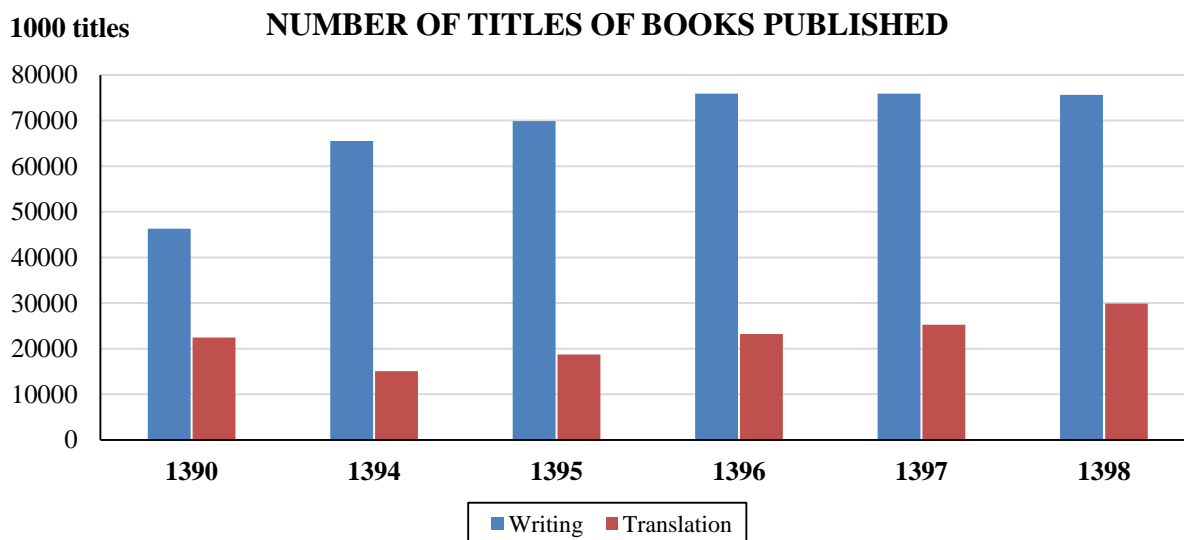
In the same year, the number of titles of the press and periodicals published in Tehran and other Shahrs (cities) of the country was 3138 and 3394 titles which decreased by 7.2 and 12.9 percent, respectively in comparison with the preceding year. Moreover, 330 and 1083 titles were daily and weekly, respectively.

In the year 1399, the number of public libraries affiliated with the Ministry of Culture and Islamic Guidance was 3557 which increased by 0.7 percent in comparison with the preceding year.

Also in the same period, more than 95,000 titles of books with a circulation of more than 119,000 copies, authorized by the Ministry of Culture and Islamic Guidance were printed and published which decreased by 9.9 and 19.7 percent, respectively, compared to the previous year.

In the year 1399, the highest shares of visitors to the museums and historical monuments belong to the Sa'dabad Complex (Palace) in Tehran (44 percent of all the visitors), and Takht-e-Jamshid (Persepolis) (31 percent of all visitors). Furthermore, in the year 1399, the number of foreign tourists arriving in the country was more than 558,000 persons, which decreased by 93.7 percent in comparison to the preceding year.

In the year 1399, due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus, there were no major and minor pilgrims to Mecca and pilgrims to the Holy Shrines in Iraq.



National budget resources for the year 1400 were projected to form over 2882.3 thousand billion rials, indicating a rise of 42.2 percent.

Government general budget resources for the year 1400 were projected to form over 13738 thousand billion rials, indicating a rise of 111.4 percent.

Based on the projections made in this year, tax revenues with 24%, the disposal of non-financial assets with 28.8%, and revenues from disposal of financial assets with 31.1% account for the highest share of government revenues, respectively.

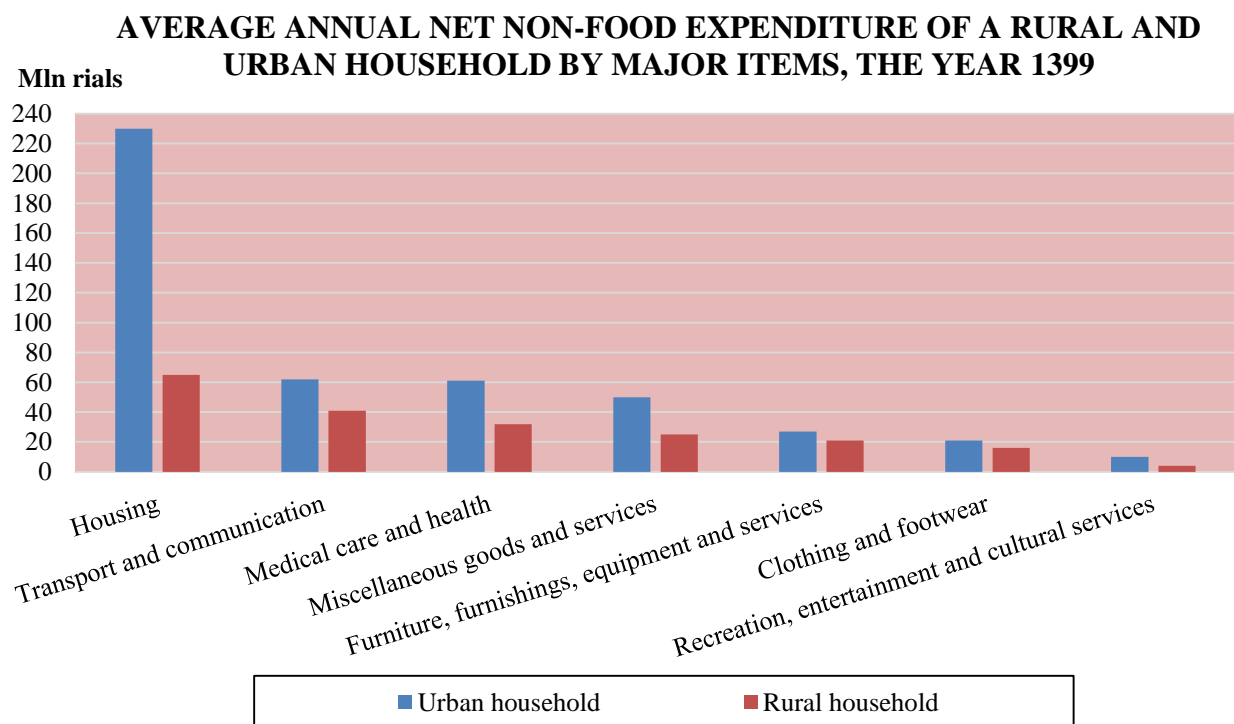
Expenses (current) performance for government agencies in Ostans in the year 1399 was over 168.8 thousand billion rials which increased by 24.8 percent compared to the previous year.

In the year 1399, payments by the government for the acquisition of non-financial assets (development expenditures) in Ostans were over 58.7 thousand billion rials which increased by 68 percent in comparison with the previous year.

In the year 1399, the average annual net expenditure of an urban household amounted to 621.4 million rials including 460.3 million rials for non-food expenditures (74 percent) and 161.1 million rials (26 percent) for food and tobacco expenditures which increased by 31.0 percent in comparison with the previous year.

In the year 1399, the average annual income of an urban household was about 746.8 million rials. Out of the income sources, miscellaneous incomes with 395.1 million rials (52.9 percent) were of the highest share.

Also, in the year 1399, the average annual income of a rural household amounted to about 420.5 million rials. Out of the income sources, miscellaneous incomes with 157.8 million rials (37.5 percent) were of the highest share.



In the year 1399, the highest and lowest general index was for the Ostans of Ilam and Qom with 286.6 and 233.1 percent, respectively.

In the year 1399, urban household consumer price indices with an increase of 36.2 percent stood at 250.6 in comparison with the last year (base year= 1395). Urban household consumer price indices for two special groups, “goods” and “services” increased by 44.0% and 26.5%, respectively, compared with the year 1398.

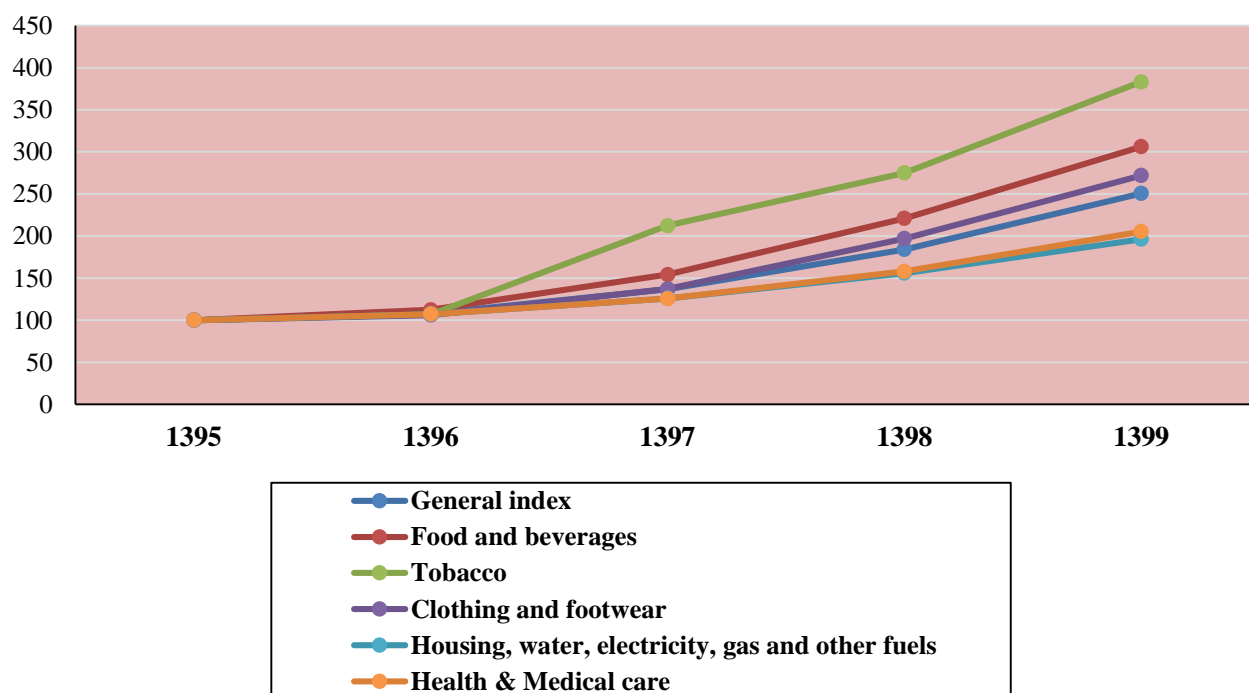
Consumer price indices in goods and services for rural households in the year 1399 increased by 37.7 percent, compared to the previous year, and stood at 263.5 (base year=1395).

Consumer price indices of rural households for goods and services for two special groups “goods” and “services” increased by 41.8 and 25.0 percent, compared to the year 1398, respectively.

The national producer price index for the year 1399 increased by 46.7 percent compared to the year 1398 and stood at 316.2 (base year= 1395).

The general price index for exported goods in the year 1399 increased by 172.2 percent and stood at 1075.0 (base year= 1395) compared to the year 1398.

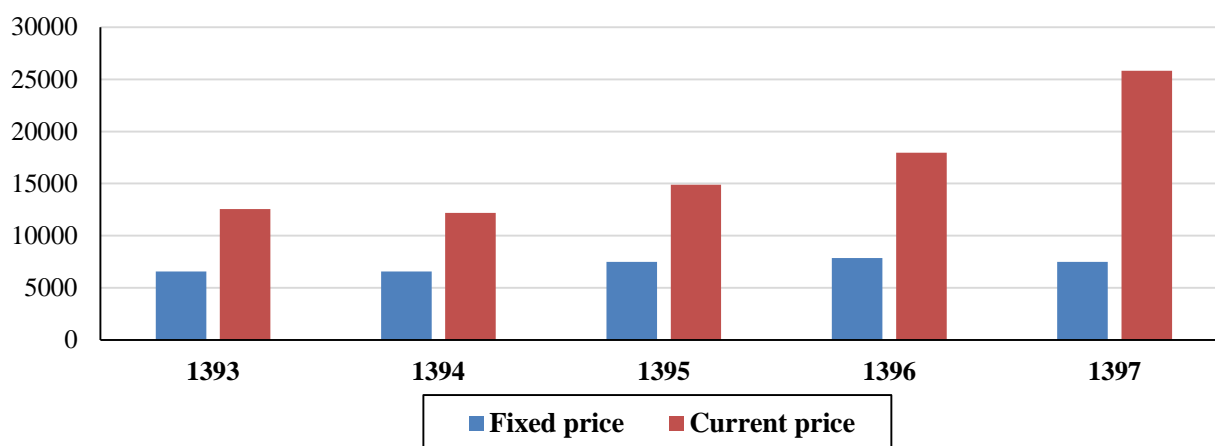

In the year 1397, the gross domestic product of the country at market prices (at constant 1390 prices) was about 7483 thousand billion rials showing a decrease of 4.9% compared with the previous year. During the year 1397, the highest share of value added in GDP (at constant 1390 prices) was for "Agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing" with 43 percent, "mining and quarrying sector" with 22 percent, and "manufacturing" with 18 percent.

Regarding regional accounts in the year 1397, Ostans of Tehran and Khuzestan with 20.9% and 16.9% had the highest contribution, and Ostans of South Khorasan and North Khorasan with less than 0.5%, had the lowest percentages of share of the GDP in the country at current prices, respectively.

Estimation shows that the population of the world in 2100 will be 10875 million. Asia and Africa with 4719 and 4280 million people will have the highest population, respectively.

In 2017, 2018, and 2019, Iran's HDIs were 0.787, 0.785, and 0.783, respectively. Iran ranked 70th among the world countries in 2019. It is necessary to mention that Iran also ranked 65th in 2018.

In 2019, Iranian life expectancy at birth was 76.7 years.

According to the statistics released by OPEC, Iranian crude oil production in 2020 was 1985.3 thousand barrels per day. Iran has ranked fifth among 13 OPEC member countries. Saudi Arabia with an average production of 9213.2 thousand barrels, Iraq with a production of 3996.6 thousand barrels per day, the United Arab Emirates with an average production of 2778.6 thousand barrels per day, and Kuwait with an average production of 2438.0 thousand barrels per day are ranked the first second, third and fourth among the world's oil-producing countries, respectively.

According to the cited statistics, Iran ranked ninth among OPEC oil-exporting countries in 2020 with 404.5 thousand barrels per day of production. In addition, supplying more than 253 billion cubic meters of natural gas to the market, made Iran the largest gas supplier in OPEC.

From the year 1358 to the year 1400, there were thirteen presidential election rounds in the Islamic Republic of Iran. The percentage of public participation in the thirteenth presidential election was about 49 percent.
